## Abstract

5 Lessons (I wished I Learned in Graduate School): Feminist critiques of knowledge production in the social sciences and humanities have changed how geographers think about conducting and sharing research. However, despite much discussion of situated and embodied knowledge in research journals, the precepts of MPhil and PhD training remain largely untouched. Recently the Group of 8 Universities (Australia) produced a state of the art critique of such orthodoxy which, alongside radical structural changes in graduate training in the UK, suggests this is an opportune moment to reflect on how best to prepare and inspire today's graduate cohorts for their professional practice. This interactive session thinks through five connected areas of graduate training that were largely absent when the speaker completed his graduate training in the US in the mid-1980s but which seem to pervade contemporary geographic practice. These areas cover such issues as teamwork; working in transdisciplinary ways; mentoring; influencing; partnership.
